

How To Plan Your Privacy Fence

It's finally time to add a privacy fence to your home. But where do you start? Follow these steps to plan your privacy fence and make the best choices for your home.

Step 1 - Draw Up a Basic Sketch of Your Fence Line

One of the first things you'll need to do when planning your privacy fence is to draw up a basic sketch of your fence line. Be sure to include any gates or other openings in the fence and that they are large enough to accommodate your lawn and other necessary equipment. When determining where to locate your fence, there are a few things you'll need to take into consideration. First make sure the fence is located within your property line. You'll also want to consider any easements or setback requirements that may be in place. Often, in city or village areas, privacy fences are restricted to the back or sides of the property and are not allowed from the front of the house to the street. Additionally, you'll need to contact Digger's Hotline (WI) or Julie (IL) to locate any underground utility lines that may be present. The service is free of charge by law and can be requested by dialing 811 or by visiting their website. Once you have a basic idea of where your privacy fence will be located, you can then begin to choose the type of fencing material you'd like to use. There are a variety of options available, so be sure to do some research to find the material that best suits your needs.

Step 2 - Wood or Vinyl?

When deciding on the type of privacy fence you want, there are a few things you need to take into account. First is the appearance. Do you want a natural looking wood fence or a more modern vinyl fence? Both options include a variety of looks, from basic to decorative. It mostly boils down to what is aesthetically pleasing to you.
